In order to enroll in EAP, you must have a letter of acceptance for one of these programs: Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Medicaid, Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP), Veterans Disability or Survivors Pension, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Lifeline Telephone Service Program (Lifeline).

Or, if living on tribal lands one of the following: Federal Public Housing Assistance, Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Head Start, Tribal TANF, Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations
